Red Maple (<i>Acer rubrum</i>)	20-25m tall, grows quickly, lives 75-100 years, leaves turn red in fall. Tolerant of wet conditions.		Red-Osier Dogwood (<i>Cornus sericea</i>)	1.5-4m tall. Red branches striking in winter. Excellent for erosion control. Produces small white berries and flowers	
Eastern White Cedar (<i>Thuja occidentalis</i>)	Up to 15m tall. Grows well in shallow soils, Tolerant of wet or dry soils.		Nannyberry (<i>Viburnum lentago</i>)	Produces clusters of white flowers in late spring and black berries in late summer. Grow to 2m tall.	
Black Spruce (<i>Picea mariana</i>)	Grows up to 20m tall. Slow growing and spire like. Short evergreen needles. Grows well in moist soils.		Ninebark (<i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i>)	Grows to 2m tall. Large white flower clusters in the spring. Tolerates a wide variety of moisture conditions and soil types.	
White Pine (<i>Pinus strobus</i>)	Grows up to 30m tall. Evergreen needles long straight and flexible. Tolerant of a variety of soils conditions.		American Highbush Cranberry (<i>Viburnum trilobium</i>)	Excellent for erosion control. Attractive to many forms of wildlife. Grows to 4m tall.
